

## GENERAL RULES

The Range is open Wednesday through Sunday per lease agreement.

The range is closed on Mondays and Tuesdays and during the late deer season for this area. Shooting hours are sunrise to sunset.

Do not use the range alone if at all possible. Take someone with you in case there is an accident.

The use of alcohol is not allowed on the range. Dogs are not allowed to run loose on the range.

The lock combination on your membership card is for the main gate and the storage box on the small bore range.

ALWAYS leave the main gate and the lock the way you find it, when you enter and when you leave, each and every time.

Put down the range in use sign. If you are the last person to leave the range, put the sign back up.

Stay on the main road and do not drive outside of the immediate range area.

Do not shoot at any wildlife on range property.

Scheduled events take priority over any other range use. No other shooting is allowed during an event. Check event schedule before coming out to the range.

You are responsible for your guest that you bring to the range. Make sure that he fully

understands the rules and follows them *prior to range usage*.

The High Power rifle range shall not be used after 10:00AM on RED FLAG fire days.

Dial 911 immediately should a fire or any other emergencies occur. Know where the fire suppression equipment is located and how to use it.

Communicate and coordinate with all others that are using either the EAST or the WEST ranges. Coordinate range closures by using the range flags.

Range use logbooks are located at both the east and west ranges. Please sign in when you arrive at the range.

## GUN HANDLING AND SHOOTING RULES

Only California legal firearms may be used.

Eye and hearing protection is required.

All shooting must be directed towards the hillside at the north and northwest sides of the range.

Cattle are on the range from December to May. Watch for them downrange and do not shoot unless they are out of the way. TSA is responsible for livestock safety.

Do not shoot the trees. All shots should be directed into the berms.

Do not shoot at ground level targets.

Do not shoot at metal targets any closer than 25 yards.

Do not angle your shots across the range.

All shooting must take place at and immediately behind the firing line. The firing line is the north edge of the concrete slab.

Firearms must not be loaded until you are at the firing line and are ready to shoot.

Do not go downrange until the range is made safe. The range is safe when a cease-fire has been called at both the centerfire and the rimfire range, all firearms are racked with their actions open and both range flags are rolled up and not displayed.

Do not handle any firearms when anyone is downrange.

Use only one firearm and one caliber at a time to avoid chambering an incorrect round.

If you have a misfire or stuck case, notify others around you that an unsafe condition exists.

Be aware of what other shooters are doing. If you see an unsafe condition, call an immediate cease-fire and correct the situation. Report any gross negligence to a club officer or leave a message on the recording at 527-TSA7.

## SMALLBORE RANGE

The east range is the small bore range.

Only .22 rimfire rifles may be used on this range. No magnums.

The storage box may be opened using the combination on your membership card. All targets in the storage box are for .22 rimfire only.

## HIGH POWER RIFLE AND PISTOL RANGE

The white painted targets at the west end of the centerfire range are for pistol cartridges only. Do not shoot at them with rifles or pistols chambered for rifle type cartridges. No armor piercing or tracer ammunition may be used at any time. *GENERAL RULE:* If target is painted white, do not shoot with hi-power or centerfire rifles.

Do not go downrange past the 200-meter berm unless someone is at the firing line to secure the range for you.

The large storage box is for use by range officials only.

The Trap Range is located on the far east end of the range. It is not necessary for a cease-fire on the trap range in order to have a cease-fire and range closure on either the high power or the rimfire range.

## RANGE COURTESY

Share the benchrests with others. Limit your time if others are waiting. Members have preference over your guest. Notify others

when you are about to shoot so that they can put on their hearing protection.

When you are finished shooting be sure to pick up your targets and cleanup your brass.

Pickup your trash and take it with you when you leave the range.

While it is not a requirement to become a member of the NRA, the club recommends joining both the NRA and the California Rifle and Pistol Association. (CRPA)

TSA dues are current January through December. Annual dues are payable January 1<sup>st</sup> and become delinquent March 1<sup>st</sup> at which time all locks are changed. Application fees for new membership is applied to the current calendar year only (dues are payable January 1<sup>st</sup> of the following year)

Voting privileges are those of the person on the application for membership. Family members are associates of the voting member. An adult must supervise associate members under the age of 18. The parent or guardian should closely supervise all small children.
